The first St. Mary Star of the sea parish bazaar, held in the late 1809's or early 1900's, netted \$325. In 1951 Father Robert Neugebauer of German heritage, arrived at St. Mary Star of the Sea from the Dutch colony of Verboort, Oregon. He was instrumental in the Formation of the Altar Society – creating inner circles for the women of the parish. Father Neugebauer promoted a Dutch sausage and sauerkraut dinner. In conjunction with the Bazaar, parishioners prepared a dinner of sausage, sauerkraut, potatoes, applesauce, rolls, coffee and homemade pie and cake. Dinner was served by parishioners and Star of the Sea students. "Bazaar activities opened Thursday, November 29, 1951 with the serving of the sausage dinner. Over 1.300 persons attended. Sausage was made at the Finnish Market earlier in the week under the capable supervision of Father Neugebauer. The bazaar extended for three daus." (The Catholic Sentinel)
