Children's Bazaar –Sponsored by Star of the Sea High School

Our family of nine children grew up on 16th Street. We graduated from Star of the Sea in the '60's. Our mother, Margaret Turina Radich, graduated from Star of the Sea in 1937. A fond family memory is the annual St. Mary Star of the Sea Parish Bazaar and Dinner.

The first St. Mary Star of the Sea parish bazaar, held in the late 1890's or early 1900's, netted \$325. In 1951 Father Robert Neugebauer of German heritage, arrived at St. Mary Star of the Sea from the Dutch colony of Verboort, Oregon. He was instrumental in the formation of the Altar Society--creating inner circles for the women of the parish. Father Neugebauer promoted a Dutch sausage and sauerkraut dinner. In conjunction with the bazaar, parishioners prepared a dinner of sausage, sauerkraut, potatoes, applesauce, rolls, coffee and homemade pie and cake. Dinner was served by parishioners and Star of the Sea students. *"Bazaar activities opened Thursday, November 29, 1951 with the serving of the sausage dinner. Over 1,300 persons attended. Sausage was made at the Finnish Market earlier in the week under the capable supervision of Father Neugebauer. The bazaar extended for three days."* (The Catholic Sentinel)

I remember...

- Our grandmother, Margaret Turina and great aunts Mary Paulsen and Kate Mestrich seated on wooden cafeteria benches, peeling endless mounds of apples and potatoes.
- Our father Anthony, and fellow Knights of Columbus, preparing "miles" of sausage.
- Our grandfather, Charles Turina Sr., and uncles Charles Turina Jr. and Frank Turina constructing bazaar booths. One year, Uncle Frank won the drawing for a *Schwinn* bicycle. He gave it to our brother, Anthony.
- Our mother serving as chair of the Parish Dinner and Bazaar--commandeering all Radich children to our living room to stuff envelopes with dinner tickets for parish families.
- Sitting in the coach's office watching our mother count proceeds from the dinner and bazaar then, accompanied by the Astoria Police, driving to the bank to make the night deposit.
- The Food Booth, the smell of freshly baked bread and pastries and excited yells of "BINGO"!
- The Children's Bazaar, following the parish bazaar, sponsored by Star of the Sea High School students for Star of the Sea Grade School students: the Fish Pond, Hat Booth, Bingo and all manner of food.

Mostly, I remember the incredible joy, energy and pride of our St. Mary Star of the Sea parish community, united as one—in celebration of our collective success!
