### Thursday Night Talks "TNT" September 19, 2024 The Rise of the KKK in Clatsop County

CCHS Curator Dr. Chelsea Vaughn kicks off our regular lecture series, TNT (Thursday Night Talks), with her presentation about the rise of the Ku Klux Klan and their insidious local presence in the 1920s.

The Clatsop County Historical Society's TNT lecture series is a free event at Fort George Brewery on the third Thursday of each month through June. **Doors open at 6:00 p.m., and lectures begin at 7:00 p.m.** Seasonal beers on tap, food, and other beverages are available for purchase. Minors are welcome with an accompanying adult.

While most everyone is familiar with the KKK most Astorians are not familiar with their rise in Astoria in the 1920s, and particularly how they focused so much vitriol toward Catholics in the local area. The fire chief and city attorney, both members of St. Mary, Star of the Sea Parish, were targeted and forced from office during this period. Catholics, working in some of Astoria's larger employers such as the flour mill, were also forced out of their jobs because of their faith.

Parishioners who experienced the activity of the KKK locally, shared stories with their children and grandchildren of being taunted on their way to mass, and how Catholic children walking to school in their uniforms were disparaged. It was with an awareness of this dark chapter in Astoria's history that members of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary planning committee approached Clatsop County Historical Society about having a presentation on this piece of history lest it be forgotten. Our faith and our freedom to worship do not come without sacrifice. We must remember the difficulty past parishioners faced and how, strengthened through the sacraments, they managed to persevere.

As we praise God and give thanks to Him, we honor and celebrate the brave men & women and their families who stood up for their Catholic faith against dark forces. Please join us on September 19<sup>th</sup>.

## Another parishioner memory:

Jery Davis was Star of the Sea's custodian for a good number of years. He was responsible for maintenance of the church, rectory (now the office), school, and St. Francis de Sales Mission. But his "fame" came from what came to be known as "Jerry's Room". Jerry was a 'saver' and what he collected ended up in Jerry's Room. He was beloved of the teachers, who knew he could come up with anything they needed for an art or some other project. Anyone connected with the church knew that Jerry had (or could find) what they needed! Jerry's generosity with his finds extended beyond the church and into the community, and he was the first recipient of an award from the city of Astoria which recognized his "outstanding services to the community and its citizens" for his constant efforts to recycle and reuse materials.


